## BACKGROUND:

In 2009 the town of Brookline created a master plan for the development of new sidewalks and trails to better connect these resources and facilitate increased use of our sidewalks and trails and increase safety for pedestrians. Since that time, the town has utilized various grant programs from the state to add over 2 miles of sidewalks and over one-half mile of new rail trails in town. Sidewalks are maintained by town funds and trails are maintained by volunteers.

The Brookline Selectboard has tasked a new Sidewalk and Trail Committee (comprised of members of the Conservation Commission, Planning Board, and citizens at large) with evaluating and expanding on the 2009 plan for future projects. As part of that effort, this survey aims to collect information from townspeople regarding their views on additional sidewalks and trails.
