

What makes Brookline a good place to do business?

What can Brookline do to be more inviting for businesses, customers?

What are your concerns in the areas of zoning and regulations, roads, utilities, traffic, land, workforce? What do you think can/should be done?

The following challenges were identified and ideas/suggestions were discussed for each:

- ♦ Limited labor pool
- ♦ Internet speed and cell service
- ♦ Improve ease of construction process
- ♦ Allow more signage / help promote businesses
- ♦ Establish a Brookline Business Association
- ♦ Taxes
- ♦ "Curb appeal" of Route 13
- ♦ Route 13 safety and speeds
