Zoning Board of Adjustment - Responsible for reviewing applications for zoning variances, special exceptions, equitable waivers of dimensional requirements, and hearing appeals from the decisions made by administrative officials.





Rules regarding plate use:

May be attached to the front of a motor vehicle in place of the regular number plate. The rear number plate must remain in place.

The motor vehicle must be legally registered and inspected for the current year. May be displayed through December 31, 2019.
